Undine Smith Moore (1904-1989) was nicknamed 'The Dean of Black Women Composers' in America and received the Virginia Governor's Award in the Arts in 1985. Adolphus Hailstork (b. 1941) received his PhD in Composition from Michigan State University. He is now retired and living in Virginia.*

*"A View in Palestine" is a notable painting created by Henry Ossawa Tanner in 1899, reflecting the Realism art movement. Tanner, an African American artist, made two trips to Palestine, which greatly influenced his work.*

*This particular piece captures the landscape of the region, showcasing Tanner's ability to blend natural beauty with cultural elements.*
